## 1 Sit, 1 Write, 1 Flush!

Despite its title, the latest book by children's author Adeline Foo is not about toilet humour! BY MALINI NATHAN

HAT started as random rants in a toilet has now become the inspiration for a new children's book.

Titled The Diary Of Amos Lee - I Sit, I Write, I Flush!, the book is the brainchild of Ms Adeline Foo, 38, a mother of three and author of 12 other children's books including Ben's Friends From The Rainforest, Secret Hoarder and The Midnight Tree.

The idea for her latest book came from her older son, Benjamin, nine, who introduced her to Diary Of A Wimpy Kid by American author and cartoonist Jeff Kinney. Ms Foo loved the book and said it reminded her of The Secret Diary Of Adrian Mole, Aged 133/4 by English author Sue Townsend, that she had read years before.

As a mother, she wanted Benjamin to learn to express himself well, so she started making him pen his thoughts in a book she kept in the

bathroom.

Using some examples from this book and memories of experiences shared with her children, friends and family, Ms Foo brought her 13th book to life.

It charts the life and experiences of Amos Lee, 10, through his diary of the year 2008 in Singapore.

Targeting eight- to 12-year-olds, the book covers themes such as sibling rivalry, friendship and helping the less fortunate. It charts memorable occasions throughout the year such as the F1 race, Beijing Olympics and even the Chingay parade.

"I wanted a book that told children they aren't alone in facing exam anxiety, failing to

> meet parental expectations, having overprotective and neurotic mothers and facing bullies in school," said Ms Foo of the idea behind the book.

She added that the book, which took four months to complete, is her way of teaching values through a spunky and vibrant true-to-life character like Amos.

"Amos is like any local boy. He has feelings. He can be tough and weak. And that's what young readers can relate to."
